"The Restoration of a Sick King" (Isaiah 38:1-22)

Summary of Prayer Meeting Devotion shared by Pastor (15 Mar 2023)

Pastor Jack welcomed the 15 attendees that included Dn Yue Kay, members & regular friends and 6 overseas brethren, namely, Hnin, Elder Habakkuk, Hla Pui & Myitta from Myanmar, John & Lily Almon from the Philippines.



Hezekiah's Prayer

We opened the Prayer Meeting with the hymn, "Simply Trusting". This hymn reminded us to trust God, especially in this difficult, trying time for He will never leave you nor forsake you. Thereafter, Pastor Jack led us through a word of Opening Prayer. Next, we took turns to read God's Word from Isaiah 38: 1 - 22 before Pastor Jack expounded on it.

Everyone is subject to some form of sickness at one time or other, even kings and generals are not spared. What happens when people fall sick? What should we do? How does God respond? What lessons can we learn? Are we ready to leave this world, to face our Creator one day? Let us discuss.

I) The Sickness of the King (v1)

King Hezekiah of Judah, a good and great king, fell sick. The Prophet Isaiah told him to be mentally prepared to die from the incurable disease he was faced with. He had serious boils growing on his body. (Isaiah 38:1)

Ever wonder how one would feel and react to receive such dismal, even fatal news?

The Bible not only mentioned sickness in different ways in the book of 1 Tim 5:23 (Timothy was often sick) but also in the book of James (5:14-16) the use of medicinal wine or therapeutic olive oil to relieve the suffering. The correct response is to pray and seek medical attention.

Our first reaction should be to pray privately to God before telling others, and then to share with the elders of the church to pray for you and confession of sins if any as in Jas 5:14-16.

II) The Supplication of the King (v2 – 3)

King Hezekiah who was feeling very down, turned and prayed to God in his despondency due to the poor prognosis of his illness (death). He wept sore at the prospect of imminent death and beseeched the Lord for His mercy.

In his prayer appeal, King Hezekiah asked God to remember that he had been obedient and faithful to God and he had been a good king in a general sense.

God knows your heart, even if you cannot verbalise your requests. God knows what is in store because He is sovereign, and our illness is His will. He has a plan for us; we need to be patient and to humbly seek and ask Him first.

III) The Sign & Deliverance of the King (v4 –11)

King Hezekiah's prayer was answered by God.

Isaiah was a prophet over 5 kings. God spoke privately to His people through the prophets in the OT times as the Bible was not complete then.

Does God answer prayer? Yes. God answers prayer in his own time and will.

There are 4 answers to prayer.

- 1) Direct answer (yes)
- 2) Delayed answer (wait)
- 3) Different answer (other unexpected answer)
- 4) Denial as an answer (no)

God gave King Hezekiah 15 more years to live, and he also delivered Judah out of the hands of the Assyrians. (v5-6) God would give a sign that a shadow of the degrees which had gone down (turned backwards) in the sun dial by 10 degrees showed God's miracle and King Hezekiah would be healed. (v7-9)

But, do be careful about asking God for a sign. We should not demand / command God to do things our way by giving us a sign. God is sovereign and is in charge. He determines the time to execute His plans for us and we are to trust in His Word. It is also a means of testing our sincerity and humbleness towards Him.

IV) The Songs of Praise of the Restored King (v12-22)

King Hezekiah gave thanks for he was healed by the grace of God from a serious sickness. Initially, he was so sick, worried and fearful that his end was near. (v10)

Whenever we are sick, James encouraged us to seek the elders of the church to pray for us, to apply medication (ie. anointing of oil), confess our sins, to seek God to search our hearts and to repent before God. Sometimes, God brings us down to our lowest point in life to enable us to see His power. The darkest hour is nearest the break of dawn if we would hang on there in Christ. It would be too late for us to praise God when we are in our graves. In death, one cannot celebrate with God. The living shall praise God. (v9)

God gives grace to the humble; resist the proud. Remember to honour God with whatever you have promised after your prayer has been answered.

King Hezekiah said he would remember God and kept his vow to sing praises for God. While he was supernaturally healed by God, the prophet Isaiah told him to

apply some figs on his boils for medication too. Faith requires action and the use of medical science in our healing as well if ordered by the Lord.

Conclusion

Whatever God has instructed you to do, just simply obey God. No questions asked!

Remember to give thanks and sing God's praises when they are due. Do emulate King Hezekiah's attitude and you will be blessed.


