In the Footsteps of William Carey to India

By the will of God, 5 of us – Angie & I, Dn Paul Tan, Eld Jeffrey Cheong and Peng Ha went on a 11-days mission trip (31 Oct to 10 Nov) to minister in 3 churches by His grace and strength. We followed in the footsteps of the legendary William Carey, the pioneer missionary to India who came to India to share the gospel in 1793 and built



churches and hospitals and a university and translated the Bible In their languages. Indeed, what he said is still true today:

Expect great things from God, Attempt great things for God.

Church Camp and Ministry at New Covenant BPC, India

We thank God for a fruitful time with 30 campers as we studied the Biblical Principles



of Covenant Marriage & the Christian family with zealous participants from CBPCI while Angie taught the children. Pastor Babu caught the vison of having a church camp after he attended our church camp in 2019.

A Pastors' Conference was held on Sat 4 Nov morning where 22 pastors attended, and some heard of the 16th century Reformation for the

first time. There was a lively discussion during the Q&A session.



We visited *Kinderbees Preschool*, a Christian kindergarten by NCBPCI which started 2 years ago and now has 50 children. The mission team taught simple Christian songs, a Bible lesson, and games. We distributed goody bags lovingly prepared by SHBPC members.



We had an uplifting worship service on Sun 5 Nov with 50 worshippers at NCBPCI. The mission team presented a song item "To India with God's Love", Dn Paul gave his testimony and Eld Jeffrey Cheong preached and Pastor Jack conducted the Lord's Supper. Angie taught the children Sunday School class on "The Tabernacle".

We also visited the home of Praveen and Rani for fellowship as invited. We gave him and his son Rajesh business suits as donated by one of our SHBPC worshippers which fit them to the tee and received with deep appreciation and great delight.

Outreaches at Calvary Reformed Church

We spent two evenings at Calvary Reformed Church where the mission team conducted the Children's Outreach program with songs, Bible lesson and games on one evening, and also a Christian family seminar on the next evening. The children including some parents were so enthusiastic and eager to learn and participate in the programmes.



We also visited the humble home of a church family of Yesudas & Jothy with 3 teenage children to encourage their hearts and had dinner fellowship at the home of Pastor Lazarus & his wife Chandraleela



The Family Seminar was attended by 60adults and children and many were convicted by the Word of God on the principles of Covenant Family Life including youths who attended with their parents.



Fellowship at Covenant BPCI

On Mon 6 Nov, we had for a blessed lunch fellowship at Covenant BPC which was



started in June 2005 by some of us together with Pastor George & Bessy. We recalled how God provided the land and building funds despite the many challenges faced. It now has a growing English and Kannada congregations. The Elim Preschool ministry has about 120 children with almost 20 staff.

Ministry at CALM church

Thank God for protection and safety as we travelled on road 13 hours to our next destination in Telangana. The airline had rescheduled our flight to another day and we had to quickly make alternate travel arrangements by car with our luggage strapped on the top of the car securely. We started at 6am from our hotel in Bangalore in the morning and reached the church in Miryalaguda only at 7pm. We thank God for journeying mercies and good weather.



CALM (Christ Abiding Lighthouse Ministry) Church was started in 2016 by Pastor John Caleb. On the morning of 8 Nov, a Pastors Conference was held at CALM church as we explained the repercussions of the historic 16th century Protestant Reformation that transformed the modern world and the principles behind that dramatic divine change to about 50 local pastors, many of whom have never heard of this great spiritual awakening of all times. During the Q&A session, there were many



good questions asked that included administration of the sacraments and others. One of the pastors asked Pastor Caleb if such a pastors conference could be conducted in his village the next time as it would be relevant in his village context.



A Revival meeting was held on the night of 8 Nov and attended by more than 60 members including children and woman. Sis Peng Ha shared her testimony and Pastor preached from the Valley of Dry Bones of how dead people came alive and made an impact from the inspired teachings of the prophet Ezekiel in chap 37, which is still relevant for a postmodern era in our turbulent world today. Though there were

a few power failures, and the lights went out, the ministry of the preaching of the Word continued faithfully. Our brethren desired the Word of God and were diligently writing down notes and listened intently to Pastor John Caleb who interpreted the message into Telegu.



The Children's Outreach was held on the evening of 9 Nov. Thank God for almost 70 children and adults who came for an edifying time of singing by Peng Ha and Angie in Indian saree, games by Dn Paul and the Bible lesson on how the Tabernacle prefigured Christ in the time of the Exodus and how we ought to worship and seek Christ today.

Pastor John Caleb said this was the first time he witnessed how the adults were also interested in the lesson shared to the children and games and singing along with the actions. This was only the second time



the church had a mission team from abroad, except for an Australian evangelist who visited them 6 years ago.

We also noted a young lady of 14 years old who was very attentive, and she diligently marked her Bible as she listened to the messages preached. Thank God for that spirit of 2Tim 2:15 in her

We visited the home of the village head Srilathee who is a Christian to pray for wisdom for her and her team in the village work and



witness for the Lord. Her husband Victor Paul took us to his padi fields as this village is essentially an agrarian community.

We visited the Nagarjuna Sagar Dam in Telangana where we met two lady street pedlars selling sweet lime juice. The mission team purposely bought some of their fruits to encourage them and gave them a tract though they said they are Christians.



On the final day when we were checking out of the hotel, we took the opportunity to give a tips and a gospel tract to the hotel housekeeping staff. We visited Pastor John Caleb's parents (Gabriel & Grace) in Nalgonda en route on the 3-hours' drive to Hyderabad and the airport.



There is much to learn from the Lord in the small towns of Miryalaguda and Nalgonda, Telangana as

we humbled ourselves and shared the inspired and sufficient Word of everlasting life in a Gospel Lighthouse in a dark neighbourhood.

Matt 24:14. Says This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached to all the world for a witness unto all nations, then shall the end come.

We need to unite our hearts to pray for one another and missions for the revival of Israel in eschatological focus in this perilous and uncertain times that we are living in.

We pray that the seed of everlasting life that is sown in the hearts of men and women and will bear fruit by the will of God.

Conclusion


