God's Righteous Judgment and Wrath

We live in the 21st century postmodern era, which is not very different from 1st century Rome. Rome was caught up idolatry and much iniquity. In Romans 1:29 – 32, Paul writes about the depraved nature of the world during his time, and these are characteristics of our generation as well. Because of this, God will

judge the world one day. In Scripture, the noun "*judgment*" is mentioned more than 300 times while the verb "*judge*" is used more than about 200 times.

1. Reasons for God's Judgment (Rom 2: 1–2)

Here is a strong biblical and theological case for divine judgment. Unlike His birth at His first advent where He came as a baby in a manger, Christ shall return in His second coming as a judge to rule and adjudicate divine judgment. God has to execute perfect divine judgment which is long overdue. All of the world will face divine judgment which will be according to truth. So why and how will we be judged?

In the context of Romans 2, Paul was writing to the diaspora in Rome. Rome was the centre of the world and the place to go. In the Roman world, there were all kinds of people who think they can go to heaven by being self-righteous. Thus, Paul was addressing self-righteous people such as moralists, religious elites, Pharisees, idolators practicing homosexuals and anyone who have an external form of "righteousness, or religion" but not according to truth. In the gospels, Jesus had kind words for Zacchaeus and those who were repentant. But His strongest words were for the Pharisees who were the religious intelligentsia.

The condition for people to be judged is a depraved world. And yes, there will be an increase in the moral and spiritual deterioration of the world as we witness it today. 2 Timothy 3:1 – 5 describes the depraved characteristics of



people in perilous times (e.g. disobedience, false accusers). Likewise, Romans 1:29 – 32 mentions that people with these depraved characteristics challenge the almighty God. Just look at the daily newspapers with news of CBT, IT and romantic scams, marital failures and divorces and family feuds, robbery, drugs, violence and much moral spiritual and physical evil around us. The social media can also fuel such evil into flames. Indeed, the world is ripe to be judged.

Can we escape the judgment of God (v. 3)? Paul was referring to Jews and Gentiles who may think they can get away with God's judgment. Instead of having a reverential awe towards God, some people have no fear of God and they challenge Him. God the Creator will be the ultimate judge who has ever right to adjudicate judgment. So, what shall we do (v. 4)? We must repent. Repentance (**μετάνοια** - metanoia) means a change of orientation of minds. Those who are impenitent in (unrepentant, and without a penitent heart which is broken and contrite [Psalm 51]) and with the hardness (stubbornness) of heart will face the wrath and the righteous judgment of God to come (v. 5). The day would come when we have to face the judgment of God as we will all appear before the **βήμα** (Bema) - the judgment seat of Christ (2 Corinthians 5:10).

2. Reality of God's Judgment (Rom 2: 6–9)

God would judge people for what they have done. And what happens when people die? In Revelations 20:12 – 15, there is a sense of sobriety as we read the truth. Before the great white throne, those who are outside of the kingdom of God shall face eternal judgment and end up in the lake of fire. The judgment is real, eternal and forever, and no one will escape the wrath of God without Christ. In Luke 16:27 – 31, the rich man who died and was in hell pleaded with Abraham to send someone to warn his brethren, but Abraham replied that no one would come back from the dead and the rich man's brothers have the written word of the prophets or preachers and we have the complete Word of God today.

Who can stand before God? Those who are evil and unregenerate cannot do so. This includes so-called "Christians" who may have a form of religion and partake the means of grace superficially, but without true faith and real repentance. If God were to deal with us the moment we sin (e.g., having an evil thought), we would be struck dead instantly. Nevertheless, it is the God's goodness leads us to repentance. Since God is so gracious, should not we stop breaking His laws against Him?

Where do we stand today before God if He should come? Are we and our children those who are truly saved and justified (v. 7) or those who think they are saved, whether Jew or Gentile (v. 8)? God is no respecter of persons, thus there is no partiality with Him (Deuteronomy 1:17). As judgment is of God, it does not matter who you are. Balaam who was covetous failed to speak forth God's true oracles but was bribed by the foe and was punished. King Saul who sought a witch at Endor later committed suicide thru his amour bearer and ended badly. Lot's wife turned into a pillar of salt. Ananias and Sapphira were struck dead after they lied to the Holy Spirit and kept part of

the offerings to themselves, and Demas have forsaken Christ for the world. Someone asked, can we ask dead “saints” to pray for us or for the dead to enter heaven? This is never taught in the Bible. There is only one way to heaven, through Christ our Mediator, and not through any co-mediatrix, saints or angels and the worship of relics or sacred ceremonies.

3. Realization of Judgment (Rom 2: 12–16)

In vv. 14 – 15, our conscience is a standard, like a moral agent that tells us whether we have obeyed the word of God. If we do something wrong, we know it is wrong. Even though our conscience is not perfect, we can still have a good conscience if it accords with the word of God. But if our conscience is seared with hot iron, this moral agent of ours is in vain.

All of us are born under the law, and we are unable to keep the law wholly. In Luke 10:17 – 22, the rich young man was presumptuous that he kept the whole law, but it was done so externally. Hypothetically, if someone has not sinned, he can go to heaven. If you can meet the standards of God’s law, you can be justified. But who can meet that perfect standard? No one can do that (Romans 3:11 -12), for “all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God.” (Romans 3:28) We have all missed the mark. (meaning of the word sin) The moment you have hatred or covetousness or anger or malice in your heart or mind, you have sinned already. As indicated in v. 13, it is the doers, not hearers, of the law which shall be justified by active faith. However, someone kept the whole law without sin and this person is Jesus Christ. Christ’s active (His perfect obedience to the law) and passive (His death on the cross) obedience gives us the righteousness that is imputed to us by faith. Faith is the instrument by which we are justified. Christ saves us by His life, death and resurrection from the dead.

Conclusion

Jesus Christ is the only Redeemer and let us come to him in faith and repentance. He can change our hearts and transform the way we think and how we live, and He will sanctify us with the living word. Let us

turn away from our total depravity and turn our hearts in evangelical repentance and by faith alone unto that one true Saviour one mediator, Jesus Christ.
