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## A Testimony of God's Faithfulness & Preservation

I had a sudden health crisis from 26 Mar to 7 Apr 2023. This is a thanksgiving testimony of God's faithfulness and preservation upon me.

I have confirmed Lumbar Spondilysis that periodically resulted in bouts of painful movements in the feet and calves of the legs. Two weeks before



Sunday, 26th March, I experienced extreme pains in both feet, so I was unable to ambulate properly. This resulted in immobility of both feet that might have caused some blood clots to form in the vessels in the feet and which might have some smaller fragments broken off from the bigger clots at a later time.

I felt progressively breathless and broke out in cold sweat just with normal effort in any physical movements or exertion. I did not expect this to be a case of a heart attack, as there were no crushing pains in the chest, back or jawline and no classic symptoms of a heart attack.

Anyway, as I was alone at home that Sunday, I rang my son living in Choa Chu Kang to come over and take me to the A&E of Changi General Hospital if my condition were to deteriorate. After consulting my grandnephew who is a consultant in Internal Medicine in CGH, we headed over to nearby CGH for an assessment. Finally after the A&E triage, I was diagnosed with "mild heart attack" and was immediately warded in ward 38, a High Dependency Ward with continuous monitoring of all our vital statistics electronically.

The next day a barrage of tests, angiograms, CT scans, ECGs and other relevant procedures were performed. The good news was that all 3 major arteries of the heart were clearly unblocked but the lower part of the heart was somewhat stressed and swollen and the amount of fluid in the heart sac was above the normal volume. There were signs of damage to these heart muscles. They did not know where the clot was located until the scan showed a huge blood clot in the pulmonary artery. It was the culprit causing my breathlessness! So it was confirmed that I had a Pulmonary Embolism that was straddling precariously across the openings of 2 of the pulmonary vessels and that condition was a highly critical and dangerous one. It was a "Saddle Pulmonary Embolism."

The Cardiologist in charge of my case was Prof. Tan Thuan Ngee. He expeditiously explained the urgency of the treatment plan to avert a disaster as

well as the available methods to speedily remove the blood clot from the lung. There were 3 options currently being used. One was to remove the clot via open surgery. The second was to blast the huge clot into minute particles and the third was to use drugs, (blood thinners), to slowly dissolve the offending clot, which was akin to a time bomb waiting for an "explosion" to break off fragments from it and fall into the said vessels in the lung and cause a blockage and imminent death. What a terrifying prognosis indeed!

I have a very low threshold for pain and have always been very fearful of needle pricks and blood -taking procedures. During this hospitalisation period, I had to endure many such experiences, but I would always pray to Almighty God for His peace, comfort, mercy and sustaining grace upon me and wisdom for the staff to successfully locate my naturally small veins to withdraw sufficient blood for the various tests. Then I would calm down as I felt His warm loving embrace upholding and strengthening me. This was especially



poignant at times when I faced extremely difficult situations and challenges in such hospital routines that I literally cried out, "Lord Jesus, please help me! I know thy grace is sufficient for me."

"Thou art my rock and my salvation! Thou will not abandon or forsake me for thou will be with me till the end of time, for thou art a faithful God in whom I will always trust."

I will invariably feel a certain calmness coming over me as I surrender to His will for whatever procedure that I need to do and to seek His forgiveness for my unrighteousness as well as His mercy and grace unto me for I acknowledge my helplessness and that I can do nothing without Him.

When I was in the operating room in the Department of Intervention Radiology where two Thrombectomies were performed using a computerised catheter holding a "mini vacuum cleaner" to suck out the blood clots in the lung and circulatory systems while I was still conscious, I could feel the uncomfortable and pressing movement of the said catheter as it was guided into the vessels of the heart and lungs. In the first thrombectomy, the surgeons used the smallest catheter because of my advanced age and possible higher risks of puncturing of the blood vessels.

However, the result was below the optimum level of removal of the amounts of clots. Hence, they repeated this procedure 2 days later, using a twice bigger catheter to give the best level of removal of the amounts of clots. The second thrombectomy was more highly successful but it took up to 4 hours, whereas the first one took around 3 hours to complete. It was terrifying to be alone among 10 or so relatively unfamiliar "strangers" in that operating theatre but as I recalled from Scripture that God is always with us, even till eternity, my doubts will dissipate and a sense of confidence in the Lord's faithfulness will soon envelope me.

As I look back upon my life, I deeply appreciate the wonderful, loving and kind people God has strategically placed throughout my life to teach, guide, test,

humble, correct and edify me, to live according to His statues and commandments, to serve Him and to be a blessing to others.

I wish to categorically acknowledge God's grace, mercy, faithfulness in answering my pleas and prayers for His deliverance of me from my fears, doubts, insecurities, my weak faith in His divine promises and the surrendering of my will to His will, to live my life according to His divine plan for my life, and to glorify and honour His Name, regardless of whether He will prolong my life on earth or not.

For those of you brothers and sisters in Christ who are currently facing seemingly insurmountable challenges in life:

- Do Not Quit!
- Persevere in your Faith!
- Continue to Trust in God with All your Heart and Soul!
- Pray Fervently and Continuously!
- Our God is Faithful and Honours His Promises!
- Honour God and God will honour you!
- God Answers Prayers!

During this recent health crisis, I have experienced God's grace and mercy more intimately and that He is my most Loving, Righteous, Omnipotent, Omniscient, Omnipresent and Almighty Heavenly Father, Amen.
