Historical Insights into the Dawning of the English Reformation

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## Summary Of Wednesday Prayer Meeting (6 September 2023) "Christ, The One Who Heals and Transforms Lives" Mark 2 :1 – 13

Pastor Jack welcomed the 13 attendees comprising a Deacon, regular members and friends and 4 overseas brethren, namely: Pastor Babu (New Covenant BPCI, Bangalore), Pastor Benjamin (Biblical Reformed Seminary, Yangon), Pastor Myitta (Yangon) and sister Hla Pui (Mercy Church, Nay Pyi Taw). We opened the Prayer Meeting with the hymn, "God Will Take Care of You" to remind ourselves of God's unconditional love and faithfulness towards us and to glorify and exalt His Name Thereafter, Pastor Jack led us through a word of Opening Prayer. Next, we took turns to read God's Word from Mark 2 :1 – 13 before Pastor Jack expounded on it.

The 3 salient points to consider for this account on the healing of a paralysed man by Christ, who heals and transforms sinners into what He wants them to be, as recorded only in Mark 2 :1 - 13, are:

#### A) Perseverance and Ingenuity of Caring Friends. (v.1 - 4)

By now, the Lord Jesus Christ is quite well-known, having started His teaching ministry from Galilee and going down south to Capernaum, which is still very much in the north. He arrived at a certain house in Capernaum, but we do not know who its owner was. It was quite common for the Lord to visit houses during that time. It also gives us a very good clue, a very important ministry tip, that it is actually very good to visit people's homes so as to witness the people interacting in their natural family context.

In verse 1, the Lord had come to this particular house, where a lot of people had also congregated there, so much so that coming to this said house became an obstacle for others who gathered around to hear what the Lord had to preach and say to them, because in verse 2, it stated *"He preached the Word unto them"*.

The **most important principle** about the ministry of Christ is **"preached the Word**", although this particular incident described in Mark 2: 1 -13 is one of healing, forgiveness of sin and restoration. The word **"preach"** means to **declare**, **proclaim** or **herald**. The most important thing among the prophets, patriot tribes, priests, old and New Testament apostles is the **"preaching"**, which is the most important ministry of all time, although other physical aspects such has looking after the sick or counselling/comforting the bereaved are also just as important, but **"preaching"** has to do with the **"Word"**. The **"Word"** refers to the **Old Testament**, the **Scriptures** and **parables** based on the Lord's own **authority**. The Word is the very substance from whence the Lord preached.

As the Lord was preaching in that overcrowded house, a paralysed man on a bed carried by his 4 friends, as stated in verse 3, was trying to enter the house but failed.

His 4 friends, who were caring friends, did not give up trying to enter the house. They persevered, even though there was no way they could have entered through the normal doorway, owing to the sheer massive size of the **"press"**, which means **"crowd"** as stated in verse 4. Using their **ingenuity**, **the 4 caring friends removed part of the roof and** 

successfully lowered the paralysed man on his bed into the house to seek divine healing from Christ.

This also reminds us that often times, even when we obey God's bidding, we may still encounter many **hindrances /challenges** to our correct actions/responses, so that it will require us to **overcome** some obstacles. Thus we must have that **enduring and persevering spirit** to go through the right moves/decisions despite some negative vibes/sentiments. Thus God **expects** us to use our **naturally-endowed gifts** to help others, especially in the Kingdom of God, to **exalt** and **glorify His Name**. We must continue to try to help others, especially if we are Christians. The 4 caring friends faced the **risks of offending/insulting** the house owner by removing part of his roof and barging into his home and also offending Christ for disturbing Him halfway through His preaching session, but they **continued** in their efforts to help their sick friend to seek Christ for healing. Despite all the obvious obstacles, these caring, true friends **persevered on** to bring the man with the palsy to Christ, whom they all **believed**, in Christ and that He was able to **cure** him of his affliction. Only **true and faithful** friends will **prevail** and **stay by** you in times of hardship/afflictions.

#### B) Pardon from Sin by Christ to Forgive (v. 5 - 9)

In verse 5, Christ saw the faith of the 4 friends and their love for the paralysed man. "When Jesus saw their faith, He said unto the sick of the palsy, Son, thy sins be forgiven thee." (Verse 5)

The 4 friends had faith in Christ and trusted Him to heal their sick friend, who also reflected the same faith of his 4 friends that Christ could forgive sin and heal him, body and soul. Sometimes God uses sickness to speak to us or even to punish us. (though not all the time) Thus whenever we minister to the sick, especially among the non-believers or backslided Christians, we need to understand the status of their relationship with God and whether they are leading a life of obedience and submission to God's will and direction. Only when we admit our sins, humble ourselves and repent of them to get back on the right track, away from sin, may we seek God for pardon, forgiveness and healing. When we are doing well in life, we have no regard for God nor His promptings unto holiness. We only seek God when we are desperate or gravely ill. We need to humble ourselves and seek God's forgiveness and to make it right with him, repent of our sin and know His will for our lives. Then we may be healed thereafter, thus exalting and glorifying God's Name.

In verse 6, certain scribes in that crowded audience began to reason silently in their hearts regarding Christ's declaration to the paralysed man that "Son, thy sins be forgiven thee". In verse 7, these scribes were wondering why Christ dared to speak so **blasphemously** as they had all learnt that **only God** can forgive sins.

"Why doth this man thus speak **blasphemies**? Who can forgive sins but God only?" (Verse 7)

They did **not** believe that Christ could **forgive sins**. They did not **submit and admit** that Jesus Christ was God, so how could Christ claim to forgive sin?

"And immediately when Jesus perceived in His spirit that they so reasoned within themselves, He said unto them, Why reason these things in your hearts?" (Verse 8) In verse 8, Christ, being **omnipresent**, **omnipotent** and **omniscient**, immediately asked the scribes why they were murmuring these thoughts silently in their hearts. Christ **purposely** told the paralysed man that his sins were forgiven him **to let** all the people there know His deity and that he had the **power** on earth to **pardon and forgive sins**. "Whether is it easier to say to the sick of the palsy, Thy sins be forgiven thee; or to say, **Arise**, and **take up** thy bed, and **walk**?" (Verse 9)

The man with the palsy was a **sinner**, like everyone else, so it was **more important to Christ** that he be **pardoned** and **forgiven** from his **sins** than the **actual physical healing** of his paralysis. **Sin has its consequences**. If we submit and not challenge God's authority, sovereignty and power, and repent from our sins, God will pardon and forgive us of our transgressions and heal and restore us. Christ knew that the paralysed man had a **greater** and **more important need** to have **his sins forgiven** by Christ than merely have his **physical** affliction **healed by Him.** Thus **only Jesus Christ** can effect our **pardon from sin** to **forgive** us of our transgressions against God.

### C) Power to Heal our Body and Soul. (v. 10 – 13)

(Verse 10) "But that ye may know that the Son of man hath **power on earth** to **forgive sins**, (he saith to the sick of the palsy."

Jesus Christ stated that He has the power on earth to forgive sins in verse 10 and then turned to the paralysed man to do 3 actions, as in verse 11.

(Verse 11) "I say unto thee, Arise, and take up thy bed, and go thy way into thine house." The paralysed man promptly "arose", "took up" his bed and "went" forth into his house. This sick man had faith and obedience which helped him to be granted pardon and forgiveness from sin and healing and restoration from sickness. We should also emulate his example to achieve this end in life.


(Verse 12) "And immediately he arose, took up the bed, and went forth before them all; insomuch that they were all amazed, and glorified God, saying, We never saw it on this fashion." The paralysed man promptly obeyed and carried out all the 3 actions ordered by Christ. At the **end of all the preaching**, the people will **glorify** God and lead fruitful and righteous lives that God has ordained for them.

(Verse 13) "And he went forth again by the sea side; and all the multitude resorted unto him, and he taught them."

After the paralysed man was healed and walked home, Christ **continued** with his **preaching**, **teaching**, **healing** and **comfort** ministry near the seaside again. **Conclusion**:

From this interesting account of the healing of the man with palsy, we perceive that **Christ** is the **supreme authority** on earth to **pardon** and **forgive sin** and **heal**, **restore** and **transform** our **lives** into what He **ordains us to be**, through our **faith**, **humility**, **obedience and submission to His will.** Amen.
